<p>Activity details</p>	<p>Activity: Planting and mulching young trees</p> <p>Background: Trees for Cities is working in partnership with the London Borough of Redbridge and Vision Redbridge Culture & Leisure on this project to increase canopy cover, support wildlife biodiversity and help combat noise and air pollution at Goodmayes Park.</p> <p>We are aiming to plant 13 trees to regenerate an existing avenue of trees at Goodmayes Park by filling gaps between mature trees.</p> <p>What Trees for Cities will provide:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Tools · Supervision and training · Lunch and refreshments

Location	 <p>Goodmayes Park Aberdour Rd, Ilford IG3 9RT</p> <p>The site is approximately 15 minutes walk from Goodmayes Station. There are a number of entrances to Goodmayes Park. To find the Trees for Cities planting day registration, head towards Emerald Cafe Bistro or ///handle.dome.epic where you will find the Trees for Cities gazebos and registration point. The blue cross marks the meeting point.</p> <p>We ask volunteers to use public transport, walk or cycle when possible. Car parking will be limited – please consider the needs of those who need to travel by car as a priority.</p> <p>There are planned rail strikes on the 18th March, but the Elizabeth Line running East from central London is not going to be impacted.</p>
