1. Collect everything you need and go outside.



2. Choose the spot where your tree is going to go, staff will spray a circle. Tidy up the area. Weed and trim the grass.




3. Remove the top layer of turf, about 10cm deep.




Why? Grass acts in competition with the tree, taking the nutrients and water from the soil. Removing the turf helps the tree roots to grow out into the surrounding area.



4. Dig a circular hole the same depth as the blade of a spade and the width of two. Put the soil on a plastic sheet.




5. Loosen up the soil in the bottom of the hole.



Why? This helps get the roots started.

6. The staff will use a post rammer to hit 2 stakes into the ground, one either side of the tree.



Why? The posts will help support the tree against strong winds.



7. Unwrap the tree, gently rub the roots to they are encouraged to grow outwards. Carefully place the tree in between the two posts.






8. Before replacing the soil that you placed on the plastic sheet, sift through it, and get rid of any stones. The whilst one person holds the tree straight, the other person replaces the soil. Firm the soil with your foot.






9. Staff will tie the tree to the posts either side with some jute straps and then they will nail them in place.








10. Replace the layer of turf you removed, upside down.



11. Pour one wheelbarrow full of mulch at the bottom of each tree and spread it in a circle around the tree. Make sure there isn't any touching the stem of the tree.



Why? If the mulch is touching the stem of the tree, it could rot.

12. Using the watering can, give the tree a big drink of water.












Planting Trees: Safety Guide













Planting trees can be dangerous, because we are using tools.









It is important to understand rules to keep safe.













Wear gloves at all times and a helmet if you're helping with the stakes.









Be careful using the tools near other people.















When you're not using them, tools must be kept in the toolbox.

















When you're not using them, keep spades or forks dug in the ground











lay it down, be careful not to trip.















Take breaks! Make sure you warm up your muscles at the start & cool down at the end.
