



<p>Activity details</p>	<p>Activity: Planting young trees</p> <p>Background: Trees for Cities is working in partnership with London Borough of Tower Hamlets to plant young trees in Weavers Fields. While the risk of COVID transmission is quite low during this outdoor event we do ask that attendees help us manage the risk by avoiding congregating at the entrances and exits to the park and around the marquees. TREES FOR CITIES COVID-19 VOLUNTEER DISCLAIMER

Before attending any Trees for Cities' community tree planting workshops and events, all volunteers must read the following:

1. Do not attend any Trees for Cities event if you or a member of your household has exhibited signs of Covid-19, or if you have received a contact-tracing alert, in accordance with current government guidelines.
2. Trees for Cities staff are not responsible for ensuring volunteers maintain social distancing, but will support those who wish to social distance.
3. Trees for Cities staff will wear a mask if requested to do so. If any volunteers are not comfortable with breaching 2m social distancing whilst wearing a mask, they shall not be asked to do so.
4. Gloves must be worn at all times when handling any Trees for Cities tools. Volunteers are asked to bring their own gardening gloves with them where possible.
